### Comments:

The date listed by each bird shows when the bird was last seen or heard at the SJWS.

I did not list all of the birds that have been seen here during the year, but instead limited the list to those birds observed during the past month.

The Ospreys appear to be incubating eggs at the nest platform by pond 4. One Osprey is consistently present sitting low-down on the nest at all times.
