PARTY HOURS AND MILES:

A Party is any group of people birding together, or even one person birding alone. If the same group is together all morning and stays together all afternoon, that's one party. But, if the same people are together all morning, then later split into 2 groups they become two new parties (for a Total of 3 groups). It does NOT matter how many people are in each party. The CBC statistics are based on "parties", not "people".

Estimate how much of your daytime birding efforts were on foot, in a vehicle, or on a boat. "Night" is before 6:30 AM or after 5:30 PM. Keep nighttime activities (owling & raiting) separate from daytime. If you take any long breaks (like for lunch) subtract that from your total hours.
