Conservation Letters of Commendation

Each year at the Sea and Saeg Audubon Annual Dinner, the Conservation Committee presents Letters of Commendation to individuals or organizations that have made noteworthy contributions to the protection of habitats, natural resources, birds and wildlife, in Orange County (occasionaly beyond OC). The table below provides brief summaries on recipients of these letters and their contributions.

Letter of Commendation Recipients

2024

Orange County Parks, Nix Nature Center: for protecting birds from window strikes. The Nix Center installed bird deterrent film with rows of barely visible dots on large windows that were having repeated bird strikes. Birds do not recognize glass as a solid object and when it reflects habitats, it tricks them into flying into the glass and often dying. Researchers estimate that up to 1 billion birds die every year in the United States alone from colliding with glass. The dots are hardly noticeable to human visitors but are real lifesavers to the avian visitors!

Huntington Beach Central Library and Supporters: for protecting birds by adding strike deterrents to their windows. After being alerted by visitors and area residents that hummingbirds were dying in large

	numbers after striking the library's massive windows, the library applied bird deterrent film over selected problem windows. The costs of the treatment were covered by an anonymous donation for the materials and the challenging installation job. Since installation, the library has received no reports of dead birds.
2023	Samuel Bressler: For establishing, organizing, and leading the Puente Chino Hills Count Circle. This count has grown in diversity, participants, and birds counted each year since it began 3 years ago, contributing valuable avian data from a local area previously not included in the Christmas Bird Count. Eco Now (Thea Merritt) for establishing Eco Now stores that offer refills for cleaning and personal hygiene products as well as non-plastic and reusable items. They give much needed options to customers who want to adopt zero-waste consumerism.
2022	Congressman Alan Lowenthal for his role, during many years of service to the people of his district and the nation, in protecting birds and other natural resources, including the introduction of the Migratory Bird Protection Act, the Albatross and Petrel Conservation Act and legislation to ban further oil drilling in federal waters off the coast of California.
2021	Peggy Chase for protecting raptors as educator and volunteer coordinator and through work to achieve new location for the Orange County Bird of Prey Center Christine Tischer for sustained time, effort, and energy over 20 years to provide a program that has ensured a successful breeding Tree Swallow population in OC
2020	Frank and Joann Randall for their support to save Banning Ranch and their pledge of \$50 million for its acquisition
2019	Lana Nguyen for protection of local coastal resources, including threatened species. We commend Lana, as a California State Park Environmental Scientist, for balancing the duty to protect sensitive birds while respecting the rights of the beach goer. Her guidance to protect two Western Snowy Plover nests this summer resulted in the first Snowy Plovers in decades to fledge from Huntington State Beach near the Santa Ana River. Audubon California, in appreciation of their efforts and advances relating to Federal environmental cutbacks; funding for the Salton Sea; protection of marine fisheries; promotion and assistance with chapter advocacy; and Tri-colored Blackbird listing
